# Stephenville demonstrates its determination to win

The Yellow Jackets overcome a late mistake.

In a game that featured offensive fireworks to the tune of 95 combined points, it was the Stephenville Yellow Jackets' defense and special teams that stepped up and made huge plays in the closing seconds to preserve a 48-47 upset win over the Aledo Bearcats on Friday.

The Yellow Jackets stopped Aledo's heralded running back, Johnathan Gray, on a 2-point conversion run that would have given the Bearcats the lead with just 1:26 left to play, recovered an onside kick and then blocked two field goals in consecutive plays in the last five seconds.

"Obviously with a win like that you try and build on it," Stephenville coach Joseph Gillespie said. "They've been a nemesis and kind of a thorn in my side. We had lost the last five games to them up until Friday night. They're a great football team but our kids kept playing and it's a great teaching tool for football and life."

As Aledo lined up for the shot at a game-winning field goal, it appeared that the two-time defending state champs were going to squeak out a win and pad their 29-game win-

the kick," Gillespie said. "The only thing I had to do then was gather my guys and tell them that they did it once, they have to do it again."

When senior linebacker Padyn Diebler blocked Aledo's second field-goal attempt, it was finally time for the Yellow Jacket nation to celebrate.

The win moved Stephenville into The Associated Press state poll at No. 4 in Class 4A, while Aledo dropped from the top spot to No. 7.

## Thoroughbreds

It looks as if the Arlington Colts are going to have no problem putting up points this season. They rolled up an area-best 631 total yards of offense, needing every bit in a 49-42 overtime victory over Plano East.

Arlington's balanced attack was spearheaded by senior quarterback Josh Greer, who threw for 444 yards and four touchdowns, including the game-winner to receiver Calvin Parker from 25 yards out in the extra period. Parker finished with 10 catches for 189 yards and the score.

Colts running back Tavarreon Dickerson gashed Plano East for 184 rushing yards and two TDs. Dickerson also scored on a 3-yard run with no time remaining to send the game to overtime.
