Arlington rolls past Weatherford behind back's big night

ARLINGTON -- It's hard to look past running back Tavarreon Dickerson's offensive production this season.

When he posted his fifth 100-yard rushing game in the first quarter of Thursday's District 4-5A game, it vaulted the Colts to an easy 57-7 victory over Weatherford at Cravens Field.



Accounting for 230 all-purpose yards and five touchdowns, Dickerson added something else to his résumé: pass-catching running back.

He splintered his season numbers of eight catches for 58 yards with two screen receptions from quarterback Josh Greer for 83 yards and a touchdown.

It was an overwhelming performance that left Weatherford searching for answers.

Arlington rolled up 551 yards offense and 24 first downs.

Weatherford had flashes of life, but couldn't connect early.

After Arlington's first score, the Kangaroos went 52 yards in nine plays where their drive stalled with a fumble.

Weatherford's only score came near the end of the first half when Austin Livingston slipped behind coverage and ran under a Stephen Pitts pass for a 60-yard touchdown.

But Dickerson was just too much.

He opened up the scoring on Arlington's first official play from scrimmage with a 35-yard run off right tackle.

He would tack on another scoring run from 66 yards on the Colts' next possession.
